Monetary and In-kind Support:



And none of these things could happen without a team that chases the dream. Our dedicated board members often wear two hats, serving as board members and officers to maintain organizational


oversight and also serving as appointed directors, keeping the day-to-day operations and services running smoothly. Meet our core team:

A Letter from the President

It is a beautiful thing to watch a wish come true. That is exactly what has happened over the last year and a half, since the day The Fostered Gift became more than words on paper. A young girl's desire to give back what she was given morphed from a dream to a reality right before her eyes. It has been a breathtaking experience. And a fast one.

As anyone of the founding members can tell you, the time has flown by quickly. Thanks to a loving community that has embraced our mission, a board of the most compassionate humans who have given their time, and numerous mentors who have encouraged our goals and lifted us up in their prayers, TFG has grown rapidly from plans into action, and is on track to continue to do so.

We are beyond thankful to those who have supported our work and, in many cases, made our jobs possible. What started with an idea to help foster children entering custody soon expanded to encompass any child unable to return home. This change occurred as we became more educated about the needs of our community and our first responders. Shortly after that, A Place to Wait locations emerged as we gained even more insight into what could comfort children experiencing life-changing situations. We could only learn these lessons by listening to the needs of the very people we were trying to help. While there has been a great deal of change within our plans and paths, there has not been much change in the gaps that exist for the children we serve. Children are still experiencing traumatic unknowns when a crisis occurs which prevents them from returning home. Children are still encountering long waits until answers, many times temporary, can be found. This has been the story for decades, and at least for now, will continue to be the story. We still need good foster parents, we still need safe and comforting places for children to wait for answers, and these children still need rescue and respite. Until those realities change, The Fostered Gift will still be here, still trying to ease the trauma of those transitions, still trying to be a bridge for a gap we cannot yet close.

As we look to the future of what we know will be the same, we also look to the future of what can be better. We pray we continue to improve and excel at teamwork, focus, community education, serving others, reaching areas in need, listening, encouraging, and changing lives. We pray the days ahead

bring us more resources, more connections, more opportunities, and more ways to help a waiting child. That is the mission before us. We are grateful that you are here beside us as we pursue it.
